Vishwanathan Anand-the five times world chess champion lost his throne to a Norwegian master mind Magnus Carlsen in the world chess championship '13. Ironic is the fact that it was held in India-the birthplace of Anand and also of this game of 64 squares(Shatranj). A wave of disappointment swept through the nation.

With the score of 6.5-3.5; there was advent of "Carlsen era". With 3 bitter losses, inspite of thorough preparations for the tournament; Carlsen outplayed the strategies of our chess king.

The first 4 games ended in a draw. Both players came up with their standard kind of play. Anand-with a natural and active placement of his pieces focused on the vital squares of play, while Carlsen-with a sharp insight and surprising intermezzos (unpredictable sequence of moves) played his game quite strong. The 19th century Berlin's play, Ray Lopez opening, the trending Nimzowitch Defence, etc. were played and exceptionally handled by both the geniuses.

The turning point of the event was game 5...Anand in black pieces made a crucial mistake on move no.39 which led to Carlsen's one point lead after 5 and a half hours of intense game. Overlooking the outcome of his move, Anand had to lose a game that was analysed to be equal.

Anand and all his fans will always regret the move no. 50 of his game 6...which led to another loss in a row. A bit shaken by the previous defeat, Anand made desperate efforts to simplify by exchange of pieces ang go for a 1/2 point. However, his slightly inaccurate kind of play led him into trouble and Carlsen seized every opportunity to gain a better edge. By the phenomenal end game play, Anand succumbed for this game too.

The next two games were a tie...healing from the wounds of Carlsen's 2 point trail...and game 9 was a "do or die". With white pieces, Anand played a rare variation and exceptionally dramatic tactics! It was a point where it might have been the comeback of Anand in the game; but he made a serious blunder that forced him to resign the very next move. A mistake he would regret, a mistake he would not forget easily.

The three losses led to his defeat. Carlsen stunned Anand by his meticulous planning, foreseeing and smartness. While Anand, inspite of great preparations and brilliant play, lost on account of his mistakes...call them "overlooks", "mistakes", "blunders" or something that he "missed"...lost the world championship.

Is one tournament enough to judge a player? A genius? No. Definitely not! Anand has proved to be the best, the wizard of this game many times in the past...The 100% Vishwanathan Anand was missing this time, the flaws cost him heavily. Not every game can be won. Disappointing, but not the end! Anand will be back; and till then it's all about perseverance and learning from mistakes.
